

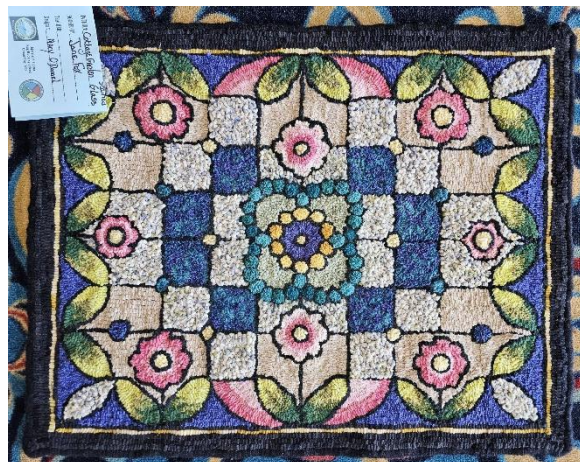

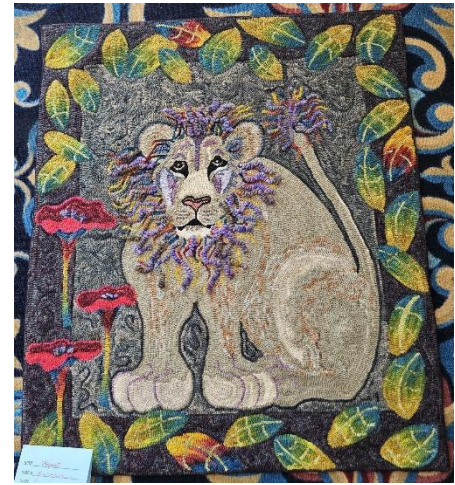
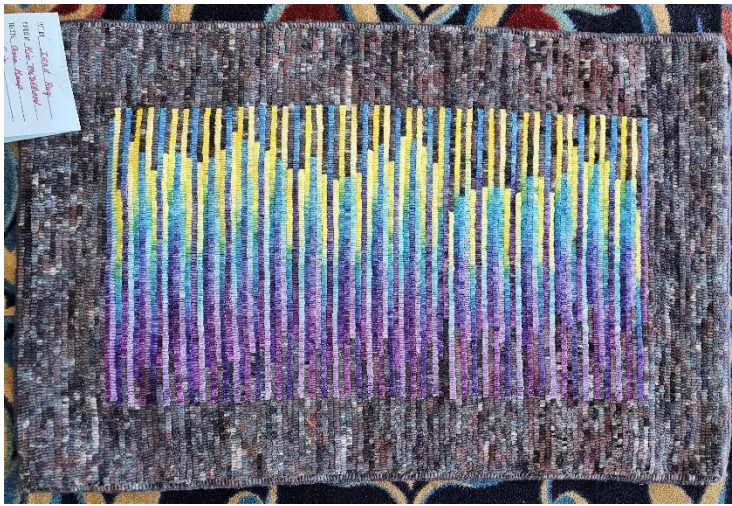

Teachers are Holly Garman, Kathleen Herbert and Maureen Rugar. Tuition is \$250. Due to skyrocketing food costs, we will *not* be offering a meal package for DELMARVA 2026. The hotel has a number of food venues and a list of local restaurants will be available.

Highlights from Maryland Shores 2026!

- * **SILENT AUCTION:** The silent auction raised \$780 which was directed toward scholarships for next year's school. Our two winners were Kate Wilhide and Donna McTeigue, whose registration fee will be covered. The remainder of the funds raised will be put toward 2028 scholarships. All attendees are invited to bring donations for the silent auction next year and – fingers crossed – you might be a lucky winner!
- * **MINI-CLASSES:** Jude Vegso offered a timely class on adding a needlepoint band and fringe to an oriental or geometric carpet. A mug rug was used as an example. The annual dyeing demonstration was given by Capri Boyle-Jones on the topic of dyeing wool for rug repair – matching existing but unavailable colors.
- * **A DAILY DOOR PRIZE**, donated by the teachers, was a fun and much-appreciated addition to our morning announcements.
- * **SCHOOL STORE:** Students were invited to bring anything craft-related to sell. There was a wide range of items related to rug hooking, from frames and cutters to books, patterns, wool, yarn and embellishments. Many handmade items were offered for sale including felted miniatures, stuffed animals and knitwear. Several independent dyers brought wool to sell. The store was well-stocked with a wide array of both basic and unique goods.
- * **THANKS to all who so thoughtfully completed evaluations.** We seriously consider all your comments and suggestions and incorporated as many as we could, including adding the silent auction, door prizes, expanding the school store and the Thursday throwdown. This newsletter comes to you thanks to a student's suggestion. Your thoughts count – your voice is heard!

Announcements for Maryland Shores 2027

- * The **MEAL PACKAGE IS UNDER REVIEW AND WE NEED YOUR INPUT.** As with DELMARVA, the costs of food and food service are at

an all-time high, and we are considering *not* offering a food package next year. The registration form has a spot where you can indicate your preference for a meal package – five breakfasts and four lunches – for \$450. We need a minimum of 50 participants in order to offer the package at this price. We appreciate your participation in making this decision – and bear in mind that there are food venues in the hotel and up and down the boardwalk. Plus – you have a kitchenette in your room (coffee maker, refrigerator and sink). A list of local food vendors will be available.

- * **MINI-CLASSES:** Would you like to offer a mini-class at Maryland Shores? Mini-classes are popular and instructors are in demand. Do you have a great idea for a project that can be demonstrated (or even finished) in an hour? Tips and tricks to enhance or embellish your hooking? Mini-classes generally charge \$10 per person and the money goes in the teacher's pocket. What would you like to share with the group? We would welcome your time and talents for proddy, quillies, framing, ornaments, dyeing, a "make-it-and-take-it" class – the sky's the limit. If you have an idea for a mini-class or a session that is more involved, talk with director Sarah Guiliani – a longer class could be offered in an evening spot.
- * The **SCHOOL STORE:** Students are once again invited to bring anything craft-related to sell in the school store. Twenty percent (20%) of your earnings will be withheld to support the school.
- * **Rug Show!** Please bring your rugs for the rug show on Wednesday. The show is open to the public. This is your chance to show off – don't be shy! And – please bring completed projects that you have finished in the past year. There is no limit on the number of rugs you can display. We want to see what you've accomplished and celebrate your creativity.
- * **INDEPENDENT HOOKING** – that is, hooking WITHOUT a teacher. Bring your project, hook to your heart's content and at your leisure. Make new friends. To register for Independent Hooking, complete the Maryland Shores registration form and **include your check for \$200.**

- * The **BRING AND TAKE TABLE** remains popular, so bring your no-longer-needed hooking and craft items – and take something you can't live without. One hooker's trash is another hooker's treasure.
- * **WOOL BINGO OR LEFT-CENTER-RIGHT:** Take a break from your hooking routine and join a group for wool bingo or left-center-right. We'll play at 4:00 pm on Thursday – bring three pieces of wool approximately 3"x12" or equivalent to play. No pre-registration required. One lucky hooker will come away with a nice addition to her stash.

2026 Teachers

Holly Garman is a certified McGown teacher who has been happily hooking for over 28 years. She has been certified since 2010 and teaches locally and across the country. Her rugs have travelled in rug shows across the United States and in Canada, and her works have been published in several books. Holly enthusiastically embraces all aspects of rug hooking styles from primitive to fine shading and is happy to assist you with any and all rug hooking projects. She has many rugs to showcase that have embellishments and decorative stitches and loves to demonstrate the different techniques that you can try to make your rug POP. There will be some mini classes that will showcase these techniques as well as some finishing ideas that may be new for you and fun! She is an avid dyer and will have a nice selection of wool to choose from in both primitive and bright colors, textures and solids. All rug projects are welcome, all cut sizes are welcome, and all students are welcome! Don't be afraid if you are a beginning hooker or an advanced hooker, the class will have tips and techniques for everyone. Feel free to bring a rug to finish or a new rug project can be planned and started, this is an open class. The sky is the limit! All students will be contacted before class for consultations so that the class will be prepared and ready to start creating as soon as the workshop starts!

Kathleen Herbert has been hooking for almost 30 years and collecting and studying antique rugs for 25 of those years. She is a certified McGown teacher, and a member of TIGHR and ATHA. Kathleen is best known for her presentation of the ***History of Rug Hooking in America***. She has studied under leading instructors in both the US and Canada and has taught rug hooking at various workshops throughout the Northeast. She is well-versed in all styles of rug hooking from wide-cut to fine shading, dyeing, and color planning. She employs many different techniques in her rugs along with different materials to capture the essence of the piece. While her recent focus is on primitive wide-cut rugs, she continues to produce fine shaded pieces annually to maintain her expertise. She will teach an open class with a short morning lesson on different techniques in rug hooking and color planning along with some historical background of rug hooking.

Maureen Rugar was introduced to rug hooking in 1978 and has been teaching since 1983. It is fair to say that COLOR and EXPERIMENTATION are the two words which best describe her as a hooker. Hooking awakened her senses to the world of COLOR – “I became aware of the colors of nature, not just green trees but blue greens, yellow greens. The sky wasn't just blue...every season it was different. Everything was alive with color.” That love of color led her to learn various aspects of dying and she has held many dye workshops at her studio. While Maureen's real passion is wide cuts, primitive, folk art and oriental designs, she is skilled in the art of shading as well. Over the past few years EXPERIMENTATION has come into play. She has given workshops on how to braid, hooking with hand torn strips, hooking three dimensional items and fancy stitches. Maureen and her mother-in-law Jeanette Rugar were the owners and designers of New Earth Designs from 1983 -1992. She is also a teacher at Caraway Rug School in NC, the New York Sheep and Wool Festival in Rhinebeck, New York and at several ATHA Region Workshops, along with several Guild workshops from Maine to Virginia. In 2016 she was commissioned to recreate a rug for Eleanor Roosevelt's sleeping porch at Val-Kill, Hyde Park, NY. The rug was accepted and installed on March 7, 2016.

 - e. **If choosing the meal package, add \$99.50 and send a separate check made out to Delmarva November workshop with your registration for lunch. This check will be returned to you if the minimum requirement of 30 people is not met within thirty days of the Workshop starting.**
2. **Hotel reservations:** Make your hotel reservations as soon as possible.
 - a. If you are staying at the Grand Hotel, call 410.289-6191 or 800.447-6779 **ONLY** to make your reservation. Use code **DW26** to qualify for the group rate.
 - b. If you have a roommate (including spouse), include your roommate on your reservation. Spouses, if attending, must be included when making your reservation.
 - c. **These options show your total room price for four nights (tax included).** Maximum occupancy is four people. (For example, if two people stay in a Direct Ocean Front room, each occupant would pay \$58.47 per night. If four occupants, it would be \$29.12 per night per person.)

 - d. Room check-in starts at 4:00 pm, and classrooms are available after 4:00 pm. Check-out is 11:00 am on Friday. Our special group rate is only guaranteed until September 1, 2026, so please book ASAP.
 - e. The Grand Hotel is located on the oceanfront on the boardwalk. It is fully handicap accessible. To see the venue: www.grandhoteloceancity.com
 - f. Hotel (room) cancellations must be made **no later than** three weeks in advance (no later than October 11) in order to receive a full refund. (Please refer to **Event cancellation** for policies regarding cancellation of your registration for the workshop.)
3. **Event cancellation:** We cannot honor requests for refunds after October 1, 2026 unless your spot can be filled. Refunds will be in the amount of \$200 with \$50 retained for administration fee. Refund checks will be mailed after the event is concluded and the books are closed. **Should your payment be returned for insufficient funds, you will be liable for the fee imposed by the organizers' financial institution.**
4. **Media waiver:** By attending the DELMARVA November workshop, you give permission for your picture and photos of your rugs to be used in advertisements and promotions, including newsletter, social media, and magazine articles.
5. **NEW for 2026! LUNCH PACKAGE:** We are offering an optional lunch package this year, composed of a box lunch (sandwich, fruit, cookie and soft drink) on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. The cost of the package is \$99.50. Commuters are welcome to opt for the lunch plan as well. **Should you choose not to take the meal package, note that** all rooms have a kitchenette with microwave and mini-fridge. There are various food outlets on the property, along the boardwalk, and within walking distance of the hotel. A list of restaurants will be available in the classroom.

2027 McGown Teachers

Capri Boyle Jones, Navarre, FL – Capri has been developing her art in fiber professionally through hooking, design, dyeing, and restoring rugs for 25 years. Owner of Capri Boyle Rug Studio, Inc., she is a McGown certified teacher and member of ATHA. She is experienced in a wide variety of styles while her personal style is Impressionism, focusing on the use of light and color. Her work has been featured in *Celebrations* and shown at the Quayside Gallery in Pensacola, FL, as well as in various exhibits throughout the country and in private collections.

Kathleen Herbert has been hooking for almost 30 years and collecting and studying antique rugs for 25 of those years. She is a certified McGown teacher, and a member of TIGHR and ATHA. Kathleen is best known for her presentation of the *History of Rug Hooking in America*. She has studied under leading instructors in both the US and Canada and has taught rug hooking at various workshops throughout the Northeast. She is well-versed in all styles of rug hooking from wide-cut to fine shading, dyeing, and color planning. Her studio is in her home and she has a large variety supplies and wools for traditional rug hooking as well as 99 different colors of yarn in 4-ply and 3-ply for punch needle rug hooking. She also enjoys combining punch hooking and traditional hooking in the same piece. She is an Ontario Hooking Craft Guild certified teacher, a certified McGown teacher, has her certificate in Fibre Arts Traditional Rug Hooking from St. Lawrence College in Brockville, Ontario, Canada, and is an Oxford Punch Needle Rug Hooking certified teacher. She has been featured in *Celebrations! Rug Hooking* and is internationally known for her teaching, dyeing and rug hooking. Seminars, workshops and individual lessons are conducted in her own studio as well as in classrooms across Canada, the United States and England. Ingrid also runs the Ragg Tyme School of Rug Hooking, which is held in May in Niagara-on-the-Lake, Ontario, Canada. Ingrid is the author of three dye books – “Primary Fusion”, “Multiple Fusion Spots”, and “Primary Fusion Spots”. She has also written the “Special Effects Using Creative Stitches”. She enjoys creating new and exciting colors in the dye pot using only the three primaries and black. The student may work on any design and cut they choose in class. A variety of techniques will be discussed and the student will be encouraged to challenge themselves on their project.

Ania Knap – Ania is a certified hooking teacher and recovering scientist whose passion for vibrant color drives her creativity. She offers the experienced student a new perspective on design and execution and opens a new world of expression for novices. She frequently mixes cuts from #2 to torn strips to achieve the desired effect. She enjoys teaching open classes and helping her students to expand their skills. Jayne Nevins is a fibre artist who became certified as an Ontario Hooking Craft Guild (OHCG) rug hooking teacher in 1999 and a McGown teacher in 2007. She is also a certified Amy Oxford punch needle teacher. Jayne loves to attend and teach at workshops throughout Canada and the United States. She loves to teach fine cut and wide cut rugs, such as landscapes, orientals, crewel pieces, and fun designs and hooks with yarn and wool. In addition, she finds incorporating creative stitches into her pieces, punching on the pattern and adding embellishments provides a different look. Spending time in the dye pots and creating colourful wools and yarn provides wonderful colour choices for her students. She loves to share tips and provide information on other techniques that may not be covered in patterns brought to class. She has adjudicated at many rug hooking shows, been commissioned to do rugs for museums and in 2021, received an award in appreciation for her contribution to crafts in Ontario. Jayne looks forward to helping you work up your piece in class.

Nancy Zeppelin Parcels began her rug hooking journey in 1999 and received her McGown Certification in 2006. Several of her rugs have been chosen for Celebrations of Hand Hooked Rugs, as well as many ribbons from local fairs. She was voted ‘People’s Choice’ twice at Sauder Village Rug Week. Nancy truly enjoys teaching all styles of hooking and is the proud designer of Rick-Rack which she has taught to 100 -plus rug hookers. A good sense for color planning will help those who struggle with this. We also work together as a class learning lots of tips and tricks that you can apply to your hooked rugs.)

Teacher Assignment. You will be contacted with your teacher assignment. Classes are filled in the order that registrations are received. Please note that while every effort will be made to place you in the class you want, you may not get your first choice of teacher.

Classes. Classes are held from 9:00 am – 3:00 pm Monday through Thursday and 9:00 am – 11:00 am on Friday in the hotel ballroom. Any pattern may be used at this school. Bring extra lighting for nighttime hooking as well as an extension cord.

School Store. There will be a school store for your convenience to purchase everyday and specialty hooking-related items. The store accepts payments in cash or check; credit cards are **not** accepted. Please let us know if we can have a specific item waiting for you. Also contact us if you have anything of hooking interest to sell in the store.

Silent Auction: Who doesn't enjoy a good auction? Please consider donating items to our third annual Maryland Shores auction. The school will keep 20% of the sale price, the rest goes in your pocket.

Give and Take Table: Bring a hooking or craft item you no longer want. A table will be set up for those items. If there is something you'd like, feel free to take it! NOTE: If the item you brought is still there on Friday morning, you must take it home with you.

Event Cancellation:
